Early Learning

All overseen by our Chief Early Learning Officer, VP of Professional Development, and a team of Regional Directors.

Behavioral Health

Behavioral Health Services in each county with a director, manager, and team of specialists and clinicians. We also have an Early Intervention program for our Early Head Start infant/toddlers rooms. And we are working on a consultation model to support all classrooms, not just special programs like Head Start, identifying children in need of response to intervention based on screening results.

History

Inspired by Betty Hart and Todd Risley's book Meaningful Differences in the Everyday Experience of Young American Children (1995), Kate Horst developed a framework for ensuring children would have the opportunity and experiences necessary to be school ready. Now a nationally recognized curriculum, SEEDS was piloted from 2003 to 2005 for the Minnesota Early Literacy Training Project. In its evaluation of the SEEDS model, the University of Minnesota's Center for Early Education and Development (CEED) found that SEEDS made a difference for children, teachers, and coaches.

Educational Philosophy

SEEDS founder and president Kate Horst is passionate about closing the "opportunity gap" for all children and has dedicated her professional life to the idea that school readiness is more than just memorizing letters and learning their sounds. It's about the relationships that develop between curious children and caring adults. When those relationships are nurtured and supported during the earliest years of a child's life, the seeds of learning are sown and school readiness ensured.
