

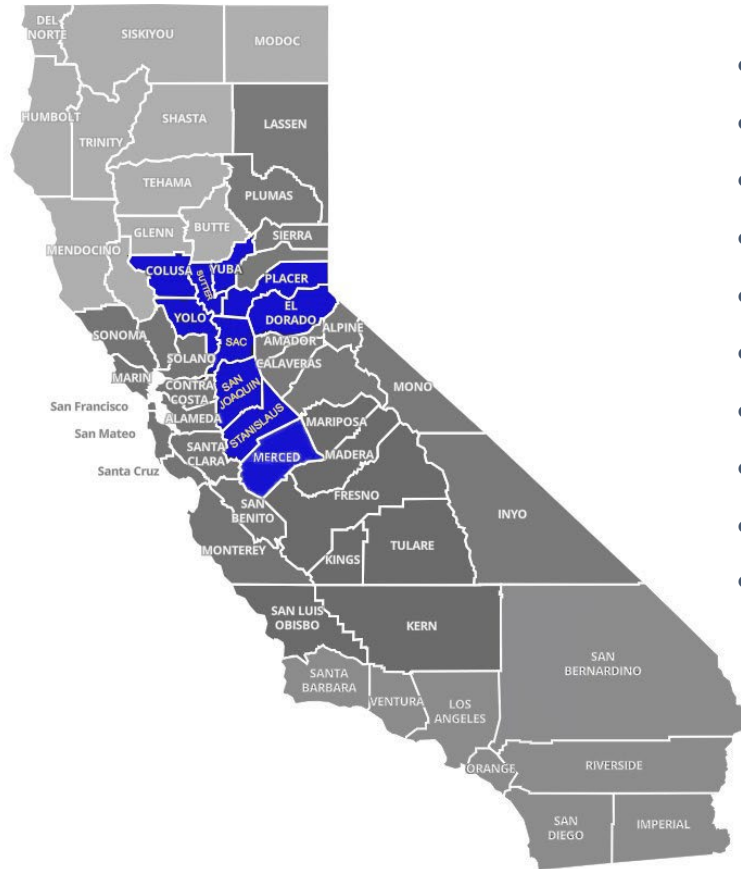

Regional Efforts: Refugee Family Support

- ▶ 2 RFS Grants among 4 Counties
- ▶ Built a more comprehensive system of care among refugee-serving agencies
- ▶ Provided culturally responsive services to newcomer refugee families

- ▶ 86% of RFS participants reported their ability to navigate life in the US has gotten better after receiving RFS services
 - ▶ 84% reporting their knowledge of which program to contact when they need help with basic needs had gotten better.
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- ▶ **Placer, Sutter & Yolo Outcomes:**
 - ▶ Average of 24 navigation visits per family showed the cultural match and rapport as well as need for services
 - ▶ 100% of families established goal plans in partnership with their navigator and completed at least one or more of their family goals by exit
 - ▶ Over 80% of families completing locally tailored culturally responsive English language learning sessions felt more comfortable speaking English and better able to meet their own needs and those of their children after the sessions.

Regional Efforts: IMPACT Legacy

Region 3 consists of the 9 Sac Region Counties, 5 additional counties (Amador, Calaveras, Nevada, Sierra, Tuolumne) and the Tribal Child Care Association (TCCA)

Leads: First 5 El Dorado (Fiscal) and El Dorado County Office of Education (Regional)

Regional Objective: Create a regional economy of scale with a focus on capacity building and sustainability.

Successes:

- ▶ Leadership: onboard, problem solve and identify collaborative solutions.
- ▶ Communication: website, shared folders, weekly emails, quarterly meetings, learning communities (Equity, Family Engagement, Coaching, Quality Improvement)
- ▶ Coaching Strategies: foundational coach training, CA QCC Coaching Companion virtual platform, regional and local coaches.
- ▶ Regional Data System Contract (exception of TCCA)
- ▶ Professional Development Calendar

Regional Efforts: Home Visiting– RTA

- ▶ Strength: One large County that can act as the fiscal lead for the Home Visiting Grant
- ▶ Leveraging: Consultancy contract with National Start Early to create 10-county workforce development plan
- ▶ Partnership with Lead4Tomorrow to provide parent leadership & engagement in all counties
- ▶ Partnership with F5 Association's Medi-Cal Managed Care Learning Community
